Michael Dickman, Caroline Knox, Dorothea Lasky, Anna McDonald, M.A. Vizsolyi, and Susan Wheeler

Michael Dickman was born and raised in Portland, Oregon. His poems regularly appear in *The New Yorker*, *The American Poetry Review*, *Field*, and elsewhere. He has been awarded fellowships and residencies from The Provincetown Fine Arts Work Center, The Vermont Studio Center, The Caldera Center for the Arts, and the Lannan Foundation. He is the author of two books of poems, *The End of the West*, and *Flies*, which won the James Laughlin Award. He is also the co-author, with Matthew Dickman, of a book of plays, *50 American Plays*. He lives in New Jersey where he teaches poetry at Princeton University.

Caroline Knox's eighth book, *Flemish*, appeared from Wave Books in 2013. Her sixth, *Quaker Guns*, won a 2009 Recommended Reading Award from the Massachusetts Center for the Book. *He Paves The Road With Iron Bars* received the 2005 Maurice English Award. She has received grants or prizes from the NEA, the Massachusetts Cultural Council, the Fund for Poetry, and *Poetry* magazine, among others. Her work has been in *American Scholar*, *A Public Space*, *Boston Review*, *Harvard*, *New Republic*, *Paris Review*, *Yale Review*, *Poetry*, and elsewhere; it is anthologized in *Best American Poetry* (1988 and 1994), and in *Postmodern American Poetry: A Norton Anthology*, Second Edition (2013).

Dorothea Lasky is the author of three full-length collections of poetry: *Thunderbird*, *Black Life*, and *AWE* all published by Wave Books. Born in St. Louis in 1978, her poems have appeared in *American Poetry Review*, *Boston Review*, *Columbia Poetry Review*, *Gulf Coast*, *The Laurel Review*, *MAKE* magazine, *Phoebe*, *Poets & Writers Magazine*, *The New Yorker*, *Tin House*, *The Paris Review*, and *6x6*, among other places. Lasky was awarded a Bagley Wright Fellowship in 2013, and she is an assistant professor of poetry at Columbia University.

Anna McDonald is a poet who is studying history and material culture at the Bard Graduate Center. She was born in Gainesville, Georgia and studied poetry at N.Y.U. Her poetry has appeared in *The Paris Review* and *The New Yorker*.

M.A. Vizsolyi lives in Brooklyn, New York. His first book of poems, *The Lamp with Wings: love sonnets* (Harper Perennial 2011), was a National Poetry Series selection. His recent work can be found in the journals *Ploughshares*, *Gulf Coast*, *Ninth Letter*, *BOMB*, *Diagram*, *Forklift Ohio*, and *The New Orleans Review*. His verse play "*The Case of Jane*" was performed as part of "The Transmitter Show—Words At a Distance," a project for Performa 13

Susan Wheeler is the author of a novel, *Record Palace*, and six books of poetry, *Bag 'o' Diamonds*, *Smokes*, *Source Codes*, *Ledger*, *Assorted Poems* and *Meme*, which was shortlisted for the 2012 National Book Award in poetry. Her awards include the Witter Bynner Prize for Poetry from the American Academy of Arts & Letters, the Norma Farber First Book Award from the Poetry Society of America, and fellowships from the John Simon Guggenheim Foundation and the New York Foundation for the Arts. Her work has appeared in ten editions of *Best American Poetry*, as well as in *The Paris Review*, *New American Writing*, *Talisman*, *The New Yorker* and many other journals. She teaches at Princeton University, where she directs the creative writing program.

Fivehundred Places is a press established by Jason Dodge with the mission to encourage a greater relationship between contemporary art and poetry being written now. With a single printing of 500 copies, each book will find itself in one of 500 places.
